A declaration form will be provided by the officials of Nakayama Racecourse to each Trainer at the International Stable on the morning of the declaration day.

It is essential that any special equipment to be carried by the horse is also declared on this form. If a horse is to run in blinkers, a declaration that it is to do so must be made. When a horse has been declared to run in blinkers, they shall be worn, and with no declaration of blinkers, they must not be worn by the horse during the race. However, this does not apply in the event that the stewards of the meeting deem there is a compelling reason.

Remittance of the aforementioned amount net of all commissions and charges into our designated account must be confirmed by the JRA **by noon (Japan Time), Friday 6th April 2007**.

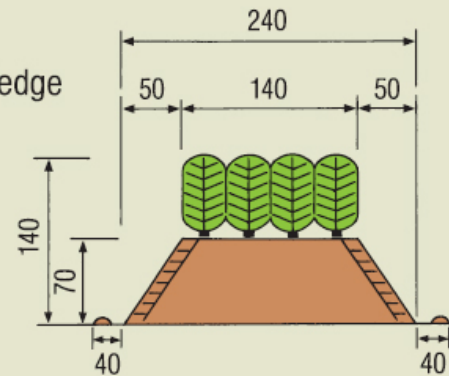

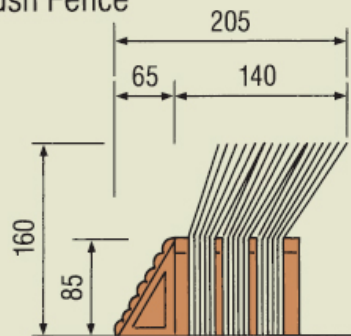

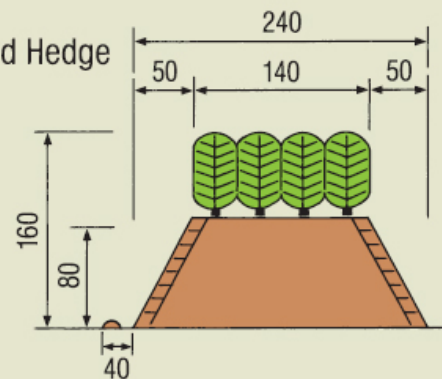

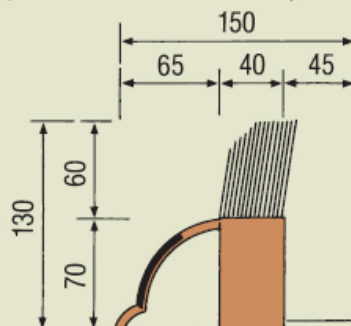
⑥ Grand Brush Fence



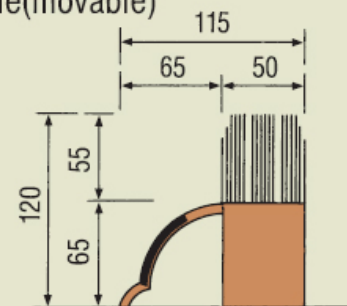
⑦ Grand Hedge

Participation subsidies borne by JRA

JRA will bear the following expenses for the foreign Invited Horses which will run in the Nakayama Grand Jump.

*For foreign horses which will run in the Pegasus Jump Stakes but not in the Nakayama Grand Jump, JRA will NOT cover the following expenses unless JRA deems this was unavoidable due to the occurrence of an accident or disease to the Invited Horse.

-Expenses paid for the foreign Invited Horses

1. **Round-trip air transportation** between the New Tokyo International Airport (Narita) and the point of embarkation/disembarkation.
2. Expenses required for Customs Clearance during the exportation and the importation of the horse.
3. **Van transportation** between the New Tokyo International Airport, Shiroy Quarantine Center and Nakayama Racecourse.
4. The following expenses for the horse during the stay in Japan: (a) Stall rental / (b) Bedding straw / (c) Feed and fodder / (d) Veterinary treatment / (e) Horseshoeing

*In regards to air transportation expenses for the horse, JRA will bear the entire expenses only in the case where regular service cargo flights are utilized. Therefore, if a charter flight will be used for a certain route, JRA will subsidize the amount equivalent to the regular service cargo charges.

*The above expenses will be paid directly to the transportation agent designated by JRA.

Veterinary Inspection: Selected horses may be inspected before they leave for Japan by a veterinary officer designated by the JRA and/or JRA officials when JRA deems it necessary.

-Expenses paid for the Persons concerned with the Invited Horses

1. Airfare for Assistant Trainer and Groom:

Round-trip economy class air ticket traveling with the horse
(a maximum of 2 persons per horse)

*JRA will NOT bear the airfare for the Owners, Trainers and Jockeys.

2. Accommodation for Owner, Trainer and Jockey:

One twin/double room at the hotel designated by JRA during the period starting from Tuesday 10 April 2007 (in) to Sunday 15 April 2007 (out) [five nights / room only]

*Accommodation is provided ONLY at the hotel designated by JRA.

*Any additional extension of stay will be at each individual's own account.

3. Accommodation for Assistant Trainers and Grooms:

The quarters for Assistant Trainers and Grooms are built on top of the International Stables with western-style bedrooms. (a maximum of 2 persons per horse)

The quarters are furnished with showers, baths and living rooms.

4. Transport Service

- (a) Airport transfer on arrival day in Japan for Owner(one), Trainer(one) and Jockey (one)
- (b) Transfer by chartered bus between the Official Hotel and the Nakayama Racecourse from Wednesday 11 April through Saturday 14 April.

5. Meal

Meals will be served to the Assistant Trainers and Grooms at the Shiroy Quarantine Center during the quarantine period of the horse.

At Nakayama Racecourse, a daily subsistence allowance of JPY5,000 per person per day (a maximum of 10 days only) will be paid directly to the Assistant Trainers and the Grooms.

Ownership

-Registration for Ownership and Colors

The application fee is **JPY10,000** (about USD86) for Owner Registration (both Private and Company Owner applicants) and **JPY3,000** (about USD26) for Registration of Racing Colors. All funds required in this application process must be submitted in Japanese Yen.

*Further, the above fee is necessary only for the Owners making this registration for the first time after 1st January 1999. Once registered, this registration is valid throughout the period the Owner is registered as a JRA Owner, and the payment is necessary only once.

-Owner Registration Tax

During the Owner Registration, **JPY90,000** (about USD782) must be paid to the Japanese Government in accordance with the Registration and License Tax Act. This amount must be remitted to the bank account designated by JRA. This information will be directly provided to the Owner.

-Ownership Change

The Rules of Racing under which the JRA conducts Thoroughbred Racing only allows the name of one Owner per horse.

In case of a change in the Ownership of a participating horse, the new and old Owner must report to the JRA one Owner's name under which the horse is to be raced, at the very latest one day prior to the final declaration to run, accompanied by the documentary evidence such as an Ownership Registration Certificate issued by the Horse Racing Authority of the country represented, or the sales contract.

In a case where documentary proof of the change of Ownership is the sales contract, the new Owner must hold a current Ownership Registration with the Horse Racing Authority of the country represented, or Ownership Registration with the JRA.

After a horse is drawn into a race, there shall be no transfer nor assignment of any Ownership interest in such horse until after the race, or until such horse is scratched from the race, if sooner.

MEDICATION AND DRUGS

1. Medication and Drug Control Regulation.

The following is the summary of **the Rules of Racing of JRA** that prescribes prohibition of horses to run in a race under the influence of drugs or medications. Please refer to Article 31 of the Horseracing Law and Paragraphs 79, 111-2, 111-3, and 111-4 of the JRA Rules of Racing for further details on this subject.

- a) Any drugs or medications mentioned in the list above (hereinafter referred to as **“prohibited drugs or medications”**), which temporarily stimulate or depress race performance must not be administered to any horse already declared, or nominated to start in a race (No horse shall be declared to run which is under the influence of these prohibited drugs or medications). Please be careful of such medications as **“Bute”** (33 Phenylbutazone) and **“Lasix”** (38 Furosemide) which are also included in the list.
- *Any substance, although not listed in the list as the prohibited drugs or medications, which may have the effect of temporarily stimulating or depressing race performance may not be administered to any horse declared, or nominated to start.
- b) **ANABOLIC STEROIDS are [prohibited drugs] under the Rules of Racing of the JRA.** Trainers are advised that anabolic steroids may be detected for approximately two months after administration, and they will be held responsible for ensuring that their horses are free of anabolic steroids prior to departure for Japan. JRA may administer a physico-chemical test to confirm that a participating horse is free of anabolic steroids after arriving in Japan.
- c) The Trainer must institute appropriate measures in order to prevent violation of the regulations regarding horses under his/her care.

2. Veterinary Instructions regarding Control of Drug Administration

- a) In case a prohibited drug or medication is administered, the horse concerned cannot be declared for races for a period of 10 days from the day the drug or medication concerned is administered.
- b) Unless approved by the veterinary officer, no treatment can be given to a horse from the day before the race.
- c) Prior consultation with the veterinary officer is necessary in case a drug or medication is to be administered to a horse scheduled to run, or feed additives other than those provided by JRA are to be given.
- d) No one except the veterinary officers of JRA or those who have received the approval from JRA can diagnose or give treatment to the horse.

3. Medication and Drugs Brought into Japan

- a) The JRA prohibits the use of medication and drugs brought into Japan by the connections of the horse on the JRA premises. This includes soap, shampoo, skin protection cream and other substances used for the horse's care. Therefore, such medication and drugs must be kept in JRA's custody until after the race.
- b) A variety of supplies such as hot and cold compress medications (poultice), massage medication, shampoo, and nutrient additives that are comparatively in wide use in foreign countries are available. This includes soap, shampoo, skin protection cream and other substances used for the horse's care. The list of these supplies is available at each JRA Representative office.

4. Physico-Chemical Test after Race

Physico-chemical tests are conducted on the horses that finish first through third in the race and any horse designated by the stewards of the meeting, under the Rule of Racing of the JRA. The horses concerned must submit to sample collecting after the race.

The collected samples will be divided into two samples, and Physico-chemical test will be conducted at the Laboratory of Racing Chemistry, firstly on sample A. In case the existence of a prohibited drug or medication is detected, sample B will then be tested automatically at the same Laboratory, in the presence of the designated intellectuals of the field of physico-chemical test without notice to the connections of the horse at this time. No person other than these witnesses can be present at the retest procedure.

If the presence of the same prohibited drugs or medication is detected in both samples A and B, it will be considered as a violation of the drug and medical regulations, and the horse concerned will be disqualified and suspended from running in a race for a fixed period, and the connections of the horse concerned are not entitled to receive any prizes, or prize money.

FEED, BEDDING AND WATER

1. Feed and Bedding

As a general rule, feed, feed additives and bedding are provided by JRA. Feed, feed additives and bedding other than those provided by the JRA are discouraged while in Japan. Feed and bedding used during airplane travel must be disposed of upon arrival at the airport in Japan. JRA will keep any other feed, etc., brought into the country.

***Precautions on Quarantine**

If you wish to import feed, or feed additives for your horse, you must obtain a phytosanitary certificate issued by the Agricultural Department of your country. In addition, upon arrival in Japan, feed, or feed additives, must be cleared by the Plant and Animal Quarantine Departments and Customs, and pass Physico-chemical tests conducted by the Laboratory of Racing Chemistry. It takes about 15 days to complete these procedures.

Therefore, if your horse must have feed, or feed additives that cannot be replaced by JRA provisions mentioned in the next page, you should contact the JRA Representative Office at least 20 days prior to your arrival. **Please note that if you fail to notify our office 20 days in advance, you may not be able to use your feed or feed additives immediately after arrival.**

2. Water

All JRA facilities are furnished with complete water and sewerage service. The water from the waterworks is potable water, which more than satisfies the standards prescribed by law. The quality of water is soft compared to North American and European countries. According to the Government officials who tested the quality, drinking water in Japan ranks top-class in the world.

1. Influenza Vaccination

Under the special animal health protocols agreed upon between Australian, New Zealand and the Japanese government, any horse which is imported to Japan must be vaccinated against equine influenza twice before coming to Japan. The vaccination must be completed within one year (**Please note that for some country, this period may differ from one year**) prior to the embarkation for Japan, and there should be four to six weeks interval between the first and second vaccinations.

If your horse has already been vaccinated once, it is necessary for your horse to be given the second of the two vaccinations. Horses which are not vaccinated they must receive both vaccinations.

The final deadline for vaccination and travel to meet the race schedule of Nakayama Grand Jump is as follows:

Feb.24 2007	First Vaccination (Four weeks interval)
Mar.25 2007	Second Vaccination (eight days before departure)
Apr.2 2007	Leave Australia for Japan
Apr.4 2007	Deadline for horses to arrive in Japan
Apr.14 2007	Nakayama Grand Jump race day

2. West Nile Virus Vaccination (WNV)

Any horse which, during the last 60 days, has been in an area which has had an outbreak of West Nile Virus (WNV), must be vaccinated against that virus, or must be certified under the conditions set forth by the Government of Japan, prior to entering Japan.

The horses must be vaccinated against the WNV, twice during the last 12 months, with an interval of three to six weeks between the first and the second shots (If your horse has previously received both shots, it is only necessary to receive a booster).

Or, the horses must be in premises located in the center of 50 kilometers during 14 days immediately prior to shipment to Japan, in which no cases of WNV infection was confirmed for 60 days immediately prior to shipment to Japan.

Japanese Government does not allow the use of live vaccine in Japan and therefore, the connections should note that live vaccine should not be administered within 14 days of export to Japan or else, there may be a possibility of your horse not being able to enter in Japan.

Please contact your nearest JRA representative office for further details.

Quarantine Procedures

These quarantine procedures are based on the special animal health protocols agreed upon between the government authorities of each country and the Japanese Government Authority under the condition that the horse, which is temporarily imported to Japan to run in a race, will immediately undergo export quarantine after the race.

As such, permanent import of the horse, such reasons as selling the horse in Japan, will not be allowed.

The following quarantine procedures will take place:

- Upon arrival at the New Tokyo international Airport (Narita), the participating horses must be immediately transported to the Quarantine Center at Shiroy (50km / 31.1miles from Narita, 60 min by the horse van). Japanese Government quarantine officers carry out individual quarantine procedures for the participating horses. However, horses arriving on the same plane will normally be tested together.
- The import quarantine period is a **minimum of seven days** (arrival and departure date to and from the quarantine is included in the quarantine period). The transportation to Nakayama Racecourse (12km / 7.5miles, 45min) is allowed only after the completion of import quarantine.

- c) During the quarantine period, horses must follow the training timetable designated by the quarantine officer. The dirt track course of the Shiroy Horse Racing School is available for the morning trackwork.
- d) During the quarantine period, the regulation prohibits Assistant Trainers and Grooms from leaving the Quarantine Center.
- e) After being cleared from quarantine, necessary follow up measures will be instituted at the Nakayama Racecourse for epidemic prevention.
- f) Under the quarantine conditions applied to foreign trained horses, the Government mandates that the period of stay of a horse in Japan shall be 60 days or less (from the day of release from import quarantine up to the day before export quarantine).
- g) The export quarantine will be conducted at the Nakayama Racecourse. The period is one day or less. However, this is not applicable in cases where the Government of the importing country (e.g. Australia) requires more days of the quarantine period than that which is prescribed by the Japanese Government.

Please inquire in advance to your respective government departments and follow their instructions for necessary vaccinations and tests.

The quarantine stables on entry into Japan are located in an area of the JRA Shiroy Horse Racing School premises, about one hour (by horse van) from the New Tokyo International Airport (Narita). The facility has a dirt track of 1,400m (about 7 furlongs) in circumference and 17m in width, which is available for scheduled training.

The normal necessary feed and fodder, bedding straw and stable supplies are available from JRA. (In regard to feed, please refer to Page 12)

Meals for stable personnel are provided in the quarantine center the full duration of their stay. There is no kitchen in the rooms, but basic electrical appliances are available.

The stables, during the quarantine period will be conducted separately by groups that have arrived on the same flight. The actual training time will be decided upon the arrival of the horses.



Horseshoes

Type of Shoes:

Please note that shoes for racing must be 9 millimeters or less in thickness, 22 millimeters or less in width and 125 grams or less in weight. JRA will check whether the shoes which are brought are permissible or not, after coming to Japan.

The trainer is responsible for ensuring that his/her horse is shod in accordance with the requirements of this instruction.

The following shoes are not permitted during a race:

1. Shoes whose calk is higher than 2 millimeters (2 millimeters is permitted) from the surface that touches the ground are not permitted. Shoes whose calk on one end is sharp are not permitted.

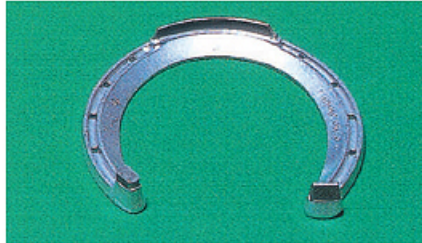

2. If there is a difference in thickness between the inner line and the outer line, which is divided by the center groove, and whose surface touches the ground unevenly, the difference must be 3 millimeters or less.

3. Shoes that may pose a danger to other horses such as those with protruding object(s) attached to the bottom of the shoe, typically crampons and notches.
4. Shoes whose surface touch the ground unevenly around the circle, and are not on the same arc, are not permitted.

Nails and Nailing

A nail with a sharp head must not be used for shoeing. Nail heads must not protrude more than necessary (protrusion must be 2 millimeters or less).

~CONDUCT OF RACING~

Scratches

Scratches in JRA racing, which are solely based on the opinion of the Owner or Trainer, for reasons of weather, or change in track conditions are not permitted on or after the deadline for declaration.

Scratches are only possible after receiving the approval of the stewards of the meeting through the submission of a document (the person-in-charge will provide assistance in drawing up the necessary document), certifying to any accident to, or disease of, the horse.

Licensing

Invited Trainers and Jockeys are required to attend a licensing interview with the JRA stewards. However, this might be exempted for the persons who have previously received the JRA license within the same year. The interview is normally held at 8:00 AM on race day, at the racecourse.

Lead Ponies

Lead ponies are not used and cannot be brought into Japan. However, the groom can be permitted to accompany the horse to the starting point with the prior approval of the starter. JRA does not have gate crew situated within the starting gate stall in order to keep the horse in check. However, with prior permission, it is possible for the groom to calm the horse from outside of the stall doors.

Starting Gate Loading Procedures

All JRA races use a Starting Gate System. The Starting Gate is a movable set of stalls with gates that open simultaneously at the start of the race.

Prior to running in races conducted by the JRA, only horses which passed a gate entrance test held during the stay at the Quarantine Center are able to run in the race.

Loading will take place under the direction of the starter. As a general rule, horses with odd numbers in the draw will be loaded first, followed by those with even numbers, and the horse with the highest number in the draw will be loaded last no matter whether the number is odd or even. This procedure is taken for the safety of horses and people concerned, for speedy and efficient loading to start the race.

However, horses with blindfolds or those horses with bad records at loading may be loaded first no matter whether the draw is odd or even. Should there be many unruly horses taking draw position with high numbers, the starter may decide to load the horse with lowest number draw last.

Matters to be noted in Relation to Jockeys

- a) A Jockey must ride in a race carrying the officially announced weight. The weight of 0.5 kg shall be subtracted from the weight concerned as the weight of the safety vest which is mandatory. For example, if the announced weight is 63.5kg, the Jockey has to ride the horse at the weight of 64.0 kg.
- b) A whip which is 77 cm or longer is prohibited from being used in races.
- c) No one under 15 years of age is permitted to ride as a Jockey in JRA races.
- d) The JRA may require the random selection of several Jockeys on race day to take and pass a urine test for prohibited substances (stimulant drugs, marijuana, narcotics, and diuretics).
- e) Although the "Regulations on the administration of established Jockey casualty compensation" by the JRA will be applied to participating Jockeys, we strongly recommend that Jockeys subscribe to casualty compensation in advance, which will provide them with coverage while in Japan, before they leave their home country. However, the JRA can advise of some reliable insurance companies in Japan upon request.

Other Pertinent Information

- a) In case of interference which affects the result of the race occur during race, the offending horse is disqualified or demoted to behind the offended horse, depending on the finishing order of the offender and the victimized horse.
The Jockey riding the offending horse will usually be suspended for a set number of race days, and the prize money and the prizes will be distributed according to the final placing of the horse.
**In case the horse is disqualified or the jockey is suspended due to interference, the riding fee will not be distributed.*
- b) Nasal Strips are not permitted to use on horse racing in Japan. Some equipment may not be allowed to be used without prior permission and therefore, please contact JRA stewards in advance
- c) When a horse bleeds in a race, the horse is suspended from racing for one month for the first offence.
- d) Any horse that has been used for breeding purpose is ineligible for any races held in the jurisdiction of JRA.

PRIZE MONEY

All Prize Money will be wholly awarded to the single nominated Owner, who is registered with the JRA, for the participating horses. Any split in prize money that reflects multiple-ownership is a matter of private contract or agreement between those Owners. JRA also does not deduct any percentages for Trainer, Jockey and stable staff from prize money.

TAXATION

a) Income Tax and Corporation Tax:

(for the money and prizes earned in Japan)

- 1) Owners are not obliged to pay tax in Japan. However, an Owner who holds permanent establishment (i.e., office) in Japan must pay the tax as a self-assessment.
- 2) Trainers are not obliged to pay tax in Japan.
- 3) For Jockeys, Assistant Trainers and Grooms, twenty percent (20%) tax is levied on money and prizes earned by the individuals at the source of income.

b) Consumption Tax:

Any person who had taxable earnings exceeding JPY10 million in Japan during 2005 is obliged to pay by self-assessment a consumption tax of five percent (5%) on the money and prizes of 2007.

**It is each individual's personal responsibility to file tax as appropriate to their status.*
